Russian war against Ukraine: EU extends sanctions on nearly 2,400 individuals and entities

The European Union today agreed to extend for a further six months its sanctions on nearly 2,400 individuals and entities over Russia's ongoing aggression against Ukraine, European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen announced on X.

The sanctions include travel bans, asset freezes and bans on funding/resources.

"The EU increases pressure on Russia," Von der Leyen said on X. "Our determination to support Ukraine is decisive."

Last month, on the third anniversary of the beginning of Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine, the Council of the European Union adopted a wide-ranging 16th package of economic and individual restrictive measures.
