STATEMENT

This is to announce that the Saeima of the Republic of Latvia, underlining its categorical condemnation of Russia's unprovoked military aggression and large-scale invasion of Ukraine, carried out with the support of Belarus;

noting that Ukraine has the right to self-defence and, like all countries, the right to defend itself by any means necessary, including international organisations, supranational formations or military alliances;

highlighting Ukraine's significant contribution to Euro-Atlantic security, its determination to defend that security, and the fact that Ukraine's NATO membership would substantially strengthen the Alliance, particularly in enhancing all future defence cooperation;

recalling the unwavering support of the Latvian people for Ukraine's independence, sovereignty, and territorial integrity within its internationally recognised borders of 1991, and Latvia's steadfast refusal to recognise the annexation of Ukrainian territories, including the Crimean Peninsula, illegally occupied by aggression;

strongly condemning the crimes committed by the Russian armed forces in Ukraine against its civilian population and infrastructure;

stressing that Russia currently poses the main and most direct threat to the security of the Euro-Atlantic area, to the peace and stability of the Euro-Atlantic area, and presents systemic challenges and threats to Euro-Atlantic interests and values;

noting Ukraine's formal application of 30 September 2022 to join NATO, supported by the majority of the Ukrainian population;

referencing the conclusions of the Communiqué adopted at the NATO Vilnius Summit on 11 July 2023, which affirm that "Ukraine's future is in NATO", that "Ukraine is becoming increasingly interoperable and politically integrated with the Alliance, having made substantial progress on its reform path", and that "we will be in a position to extend an invitation to Ukraine to join the Alliance when Allies agree and conditions permit to jointly acknowledge the urgency of decisions and progress, expand Ukraine's support for Ukraine through practical measures, and strengthen the Alliance political partnership";

emphasising that NATO's doors remain open to all European democracies willing to assume the responsibilities and obligations of NATO membership, and that Latvia has no veto over NATO enlargement or any other related issues;

referring to the need to implement the decisions of the Bucharest and Madrid Summits and to enhance our readiness to respond to new threats and challenges both and within the NATO framework;

indicating that Ukraine is ready to become a NATO member state in accordance with Article 10 of the North Atlantic Treaty, demonstrating its readiness by upholding the fundamental principles and by the trustworthiness of its armed forces;

inst key NATO threats, and that Ukraine's readiness already exceeds the individual readiness of some current NATO members;

underscoring the need for the Washington Summit to clearly demonstrate strong and commitment, with all Allies willing to shoulder their fair share of responsibility for collective security;

considering Ukraine's successful resistance to the Russian aggression and steadfast determination of the Ukrainian people to fight for their freedom until the aggressor is at last banished from the territory of Ukraine;

as the Parliament of a NATO member state, the Saeima of the Republic of Latvia supports Ukraine's wish to join NATO and believes that Ukraine meets the criteria for membership;

underlines that the Republic of Latvia will continue providing extensive and comprehensive support for Ukraine at the government, municipal, civil society, and Nato levels to strengthen its resilience against Russian aggression, and reaffirms its commitment to support Ukraine in its reconstruction, in particular in the Chernobyl region;

strongly commits to supporting international efforts to hold accountable the perpetrators of war crimes and other grave international crimes committed in relation to Russia's war of aggression against Ukraine, and supports the establishment of an international tribunal for the prosecution of the persons guilty of the crime;

calls on the governments and parliaments of NATO member states to support Ukraine's international right to self-defence and to remove restrictions on the use of military force in accordance with international law;

urges NATO to prepare a long-term strategy and proactive measures for containment of Russia to prevent its threats in all dimensions, to actively defend democracy and the rules-based international order, and to increase the resilience of the Alliance and Allies against Russia's aggressive, destabilising political, military, and hybrid actions undermining the security of the Alliance and Allies;

emphasises that Ukraine is set on an irreversible course towards Euro-Atlantic integration;

urges NATO to prepare a long-term strategy and proactive measures for containment of Russia to prevent its threats in all dimensions, to actively defend democracy and the rules-based international order, and to increase the resilience of the Alliance and Allies against Russia's aggressive, destabilising political, military, and hybrid actions undermining the security of the Alliance and Allies;

considers it crucial to use all the opportunities provided by the NATO Washington Summit to jointly acknowledge the urgency of decisions and progress, expand Ukraine's support for Ukraine through practical measures, and strengthen the Alliance political partnership;

calls on the parliaments of NATO member states to support Ukraine's official application for NATO membership and urges the governments of NATO member states to support extending an invitation for Ukraine to join NATO at the NATO Summit in Washington, D.C., on 9–11 July 2024.
