

Von der Leyen: EU has provided almost €108 billion to Ukraine since start of Russian full-scale war

To date, the European Union together with its Member States has provided Ukraine with support of almost €108 billion, European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen said on X (formerly Twitter) on 7 August.

“The EU has stood by Ukraine since day 1 of Russia’s war of aggression,” von der Leyen wrote. “Ukraine will prevail in this war for survival.”

She added that “the EU will stand with Ukraine and its people for as long as it takes”.

According to European Commission, the support provided consists of almost €52 billion to support its overall economic, social and financial resilience, €39

billion in military assistance, and up to €17 billion made available to Member States to cater for the needs of people fleeing the war.
